






Palladium


Palladium is a chemical element with symbol Pd and atomic number 46. It is a rare and lustrous silvery-white metal discovered in 1803 by William Hyde Wollaston. **Palladium** is mostly used in electronics, dentistry, medicine, hydrogen purification, chemical applications, groundwater treatment and jewelry.

A set of coin stamps made of **palladium** celebrating the "50th birthday of King Taufa'ahau IV on 4th July 1968" were issued by Tonga in 1967.

Each postage stamp design is embossed on **palladium foil**, backed with "sticky" paper inscribed overall with "The Friendly Islands Tonga". Each circular postage stamp is imperforated and has a diameter ranging from 1.5 up to nearly 3 inches.









Plastic

The United Kingdom first **motion Plastic** stamps issued in 201 show two different images when viewed from separate angles, displaying the opening sequence of Thunderbird with each of the crafts launching.

Porcelain

Issued on 20 March 2014, a total of 150,000 were made.

The world-famous Viennese Augarten porcelain for almost 300 years has been made by hand. Famous productions are Coffee and Tea sets, exquisite vases and lamps. Post with the Augarten company has created an extraord stamp made of porcelain decorated with the "Vienness which has been an icon for the Vienna Porcelain state."

For the production of this stamp since the solution of plaster can be used only for about thirty times were made with a more solid form by a pressing trace.

Subsequently, the sheets were baked at 960 degrees for 24 hours, then glazed and again cured at even Manufacture, the workpieces are always painted by screen printing method was used, the colors were experienced.
